#### PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

September is in the books and it seems time has flown by as we have quickly moved into October. We have had a very successful start up to the 2018/19 school year. Our Terry Fox Run this year was once again very successful. Students raised a significant amount of money in a variety of ways, with all proceeds going to the cancer research. Thank you once again to all students, staff and parent volunteers for making this day a success. Our total raised through donations, bake sale and the Troitsky 8/9 Auction was \$1895.05.

At the beginning of each school year, as a staff, we go over roles for responses to various types of emergencies. We then practice school wide drills at different times throughout the year, so in the event a real emergency happens, staff and students know what to do. The most common drill, and the one most people know about, is the Fire Drill, but there are three more drills that we practice at school which I thought I'd outline: Lock -Down, Shelter-In-Place, and Hold and Secure.

The Lock-Down is the process we would use for securing students and staff into designated areas when there is a threat of violence inside the school. The main objective for the Lock Down is to protect the maximum number of people by getting them into locked locations. The school has identified and taught students where to go depending on where they are if a lock down were to occur.

A Shelter-In-Place would be called most often during severe

weather. It is designed to direct students and staff to safe places indoors. During a Shelter-In-Place there is no threat of violence so the doors are not required to be locked. Some potential Shelter-In-Place situations may be a tornado, hazardous material spill by the school, or a potentially dangerous animal on the playground. The location where students would be requested to be within the school would vary depending on the situation.

Hold and Secure is a process used to lock all exit/entrances of the school if there is an emergency situation outside of the school. Students and staff will all be called inside of the building. Normal movement is permitted within the school which is different than the Shelter-In-Place where movement is directed. The main objective of the Hold and Secure is to keep any potential threats outside of the school building.

We will be practicing these drills along with the regular Fire Drill at various points throughout the school year.

As always, we thank you for your support. If you have any questions or concerns please feel free to call the school. Each teacher will have set up a system to communicate with parents in some way (agenda's, Remind App, Classroom Dojo), please feel free to use this avenue to connect with them as well.

# **SCHOOL VOLUNTEERS**

Wolf Creek Public Schools has implemented a **NEW volunteer policy** for the upcoming school year. **ALL volunteers** will be required to complete a Volunteer Application Form, a Criminal Record Declaration, and get a Vulnerable Sector Check completed at the police station. If your child has an allergy note on file, the school office will be in contact with you to ensure the proper paperwork and medication are on file.

# **IMMUNIZATION UPDATE**

There are some important upcoming changes regarding the vaccination schedule.

Alberta is moving from a three-dose vaccine schedule in Grade 5 to a two-dose vaccine schedule in Grade 6 for both HBV and HPV. The Government of Alberta is making this change to align with the evidence, which shows administering two doses at least six months apart provides children with good protection against HBV and HPV diseases. This change aligns with a number of jurisdictions in Canada that have already adopted a two-dose schedule for both vaccines.

Beginning in the 2018/19 school year, public health nurses will also be offering immunizations to students in Grade 1 to 9 who are missing any.
